Judge Advocates Report:



The first part of this is for the Judge Advocate part of the newsletter. The 2nd part is for the Our Marines section. Judge Advocate: "Gung Ho" Positive or negative? The term Gung Ho was picked up by USMC Major Evans Carlson from his New Zealand friend, Rewi Alley, one

of the founders of the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives. Major Carlson explained in a 1943 interview:" I was trying to build up the same sort of working spirit I had seen in China, where all soldiers dedicated themselves to one idea and worked together to put that idea over. I told the boys about it again and again." Later Carlson used "Gung Ho" during his (unconventional) command of the 2nd Marine Raider Battalion. The phrase became the title of a 1943 war film about the Marines raid on Makin Island in 1942. Now you may ask yourself why I bring this up? At a recent League meeting there were discussions about our League uniforms, essentially the what, where, and when we should wear them. While members are considered to be "in uniform" when they wear their red piss cutters, I suggested that we should consider wearing our complete uniform(white shirt, blue or black trousers and highly glossed black shoes) every chance we get. After all our appearance reflects upon the Marine Corp, the League, and Marines everywhere. What better way to present ourselves to the general public and our fellow Marines. Being " squared away" is part of our DNA. That being said, the term "Gung Ho" was dropped in what I hoped was a positive way. As our National Uniform Chairman correctly noted" Once a Marine Always A Marine.




OUR MARINES

This will be a new addition to our newsletter where we will be honoring active duty and honorably discharged Montana Marines.

Since its inception the Detachment has strived to preserve the traditions and promote the interests of the Marine Corps while welcoming all veterans-those on active or reserve status as well as those men and women who have who have been honorably discharged from all branches of the United States Armed forces. In that spirit we take this opportunity to honor Army Staff Sergeant Travis Atkins late of Bozeman, Montana. On the morning of June 1st 2007 Staff Ser-

geant Atkins and his three-man squad intercepted two suspected terrorists outside Baghdad, Iraq. One the Iragi Staff Sergeant Atkins was searching resisted and then became violent. Travis engaged him in hand-to-hand combat. As Travis wrestled to get the enemies hands behind his back, the man began to reach for something- Travis knew what it was. He realized the man was wearing a suicide vest. In the split second before the Iragi detonated his explosives, Travis wrapped his arms and his entire body around him and threw to the ground away from his troops who were right next to him. He put himself on top of the enemy and shielded his men from certain death. Staff Sgt. Atkins however was killed instantly. On March 27th, 2019 President Trump posthumously awarded Staff Sgt. Atkins the Congressional Medal of Honor, our nation's highest honor for valor. The University of Montana alumnus was just 31 years old, leaving behind his 11 year old son Trevor Oliver, and parents John and Elaine Atkins of Bozeman. Senator Tester said "Our nation is forever grateful for his courageous and selfless action on the battlefield and this highest honor will guarantee that his bravery will never be forgotten "Our Detachment will likewise NEVER FOR FORGET his ultimate sacrifice ! 
